

Life and death stand side by side as we enter into Good Friday. In John's passion account, Jesus reveals the power and glory of God, even as he is put on trial and sentenced to death. Standing with the disciples at the foot of the cross, we pray for the whole world in the ancient bidding prayer, as Christ's death offers life to all. We gather in solemn devotion, but always with the promise that the tree around which we assemble is indeed a tree of life. We depart silently, and we anticipate the culmination of Lent on Easter Sunday.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

PROCESSION OF THE CROSS

A cross is placed before the assembly. The assembly stands and faces the cross. (Dialog: 3x)

P: Behold, the life-giving cross, on which was hung the Savior of the whole world.

C: Oh, come, let us worship him.

(The assembly may make the sign of the cross.)

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you.

C: By your holy cross you have redeemed the world.

(The assembly may be seated.)
