Trinity Tidings



Now faith, hope, and love abide, these three, and the greatest of these is love. I Corinthians 13:13

When I was a kid, Valentine's Day meant making a special box and sharing cards with my classmates. The day also brought with it those heart-shaped candies with little messages. Some of them seemed just right for my friends. I didn't mind sharing "love u" with my best friend, but the sentiment was a bit of a stretch with other classmates. However, the candies came in little, individual boxes. There was no picking and choosing. Each person got the same messages. And maybe that was the point. It was a day to share kind words to everyone – equally.

St. Paul's letters to the Corinthians are filled with messages about our calling to treasure one another and the gifts that each person has. The church in Corinth was divided. A group of people were claiming that people who had visions or spoke in tongues were better Christians than others. They did not recognize or value the gifts that others had to offer. Paul responded by using an analogy: as the human body has many members (hands, feet, eves, etc.) so too, the church is made up of different members with different abilities and roles. All members are important for the body, and the church, to function as it is meant to.

I wonder, then, if the self-proclaimed super-Christians at Corinth had Valentines candies to share, what would they hand out and to whom?

What messages do we intentionally or unintentionally pass along with what we do in our day-to-day life?

St. Paul gives us some tips about how "love u" should be lived out. He wrote that love is patient, kind, not arrogant, not rude, and does not insist on its own way. It doesn't keep score, and it doesn't give up when things get tough. The love that Paul describes is the kind of love that God has for us. It is the love that we see in Jesus. Jesus does not give "love u" treats to only some people. His love is for all people including all my old classmates and all the people we encounter.

We live in a world where there is division. It is easy to get caught up in thinking that it is "us against them" and to demonize people who are different from us. And while our love will not match the depth of God's love for us, what would happen if we reflected on what kind of heartshaped messages Jesus would give to "those people?" What if we actually shared such messages with them with our words and actions? I think God would declare it to be a happy Valentine's Day.

May you be filled with the sweet goodness of God's love today and alwavs.
